

1. ABOUT THE CANADIAN AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM

Our Mission

The Canadian Automotive Museum is dedicated to preserving and sharing Canada's automotive history.

History of the Canadian Automotive Museum

The Canadian Automotive Museum opened to the public in 1963 and was incorporated in 1964 as an independent not-for-profit, charitable institution. The museum is home to the world's most significant collection of Canadian cars and Canadian automotive literature. Today, the museum maintains a collection of over 80 Canadian, American, and European vehicles spanning the 20th century as well as an automotive reference library.

Charitable Status

The Canadian Automotive Museum's incorporation number is 106843121 RR0001.

Affiliations

The Canadian Automotive Museum is a member of the Ontario Museums Association, the Canadian Museums Association, and is or designated Category A Cultural Property organization.

2. 2018 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Exterior Facade Upgrades

During the winter of 2018 new exterior insulation and cladding was added to the museum, which improved the temperature inside as well as the curb appeal from Simcoe St. The addition of cameras and safety lighting made the site more suitable for evening events and helped improve safety in the downtown area.



HVAC, Plumbing, & Electrical Upgrades

With funding from all three levels of government, the museum was able to replace its aging water pipes and electrical service. These behind-thescenes changes will allow for a higher visitor capacity and for the installation of new lighting and exhibit elements. The most noticeable change was the installation of heating and air conditioning in the north room and lobby.

Main Gallery Refreshed

New lighting, paint, and glass window panes brought a new look and feel to the main gallery. Our museum volunteers brought back the historic character of the 1920s car dealership by restoring the original windows and removing the 1960s wood paneling. New track lighting added a new feel to space, making the gallery look brighter and larger than before.

3. 2018 EXHIBITS

Junk in Your Trunk

Sponsored by Myseum of Toronto, Junk in Your Trunk opened in November 2018. The exhibit traces the origins and evolution of storage space in cars from 19th century carriages to the 2010s Teslas.

New Interpretive Panels

Curatorial Intern Nowreen Haque completed new interpretive panels for three cars on display: the 1927 Isotta Fraschini, the 1912 Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost, and the 1935 Rolls-Royce 20/25.



Lightning McQueen

Ka-chow! The star of Disney/Pixar's Cars 3, Lightning McQueen, gave a huge boost to attendance in 2018. Kids of all ages were excited to get their picture taken with this movie star. Lightning has extended his stay at the CAM through 2019.



Multilingual Gallery Guides

Multilingual gallery guides were developed with a grant from the Ontario Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration. Five stations were created in the museum with different themes. This allows visitors to lean about Canadian cars in Russian, German, Mandarin, Portuguese, Spanish, and Arabic.



4. 2018 ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMS

Guided Tours and School Visits

51 groups visited the museum including school groups, Cub Scouts and Girl Guide troops, bus tours, and car clubs. A special thank you to all of our volunteer tour guides who bring the collection to life for visitors.

Gallery & Walking Tours



Gallery highlight tours were scheduled for every Saturday afternoon, with special themed tours taking place once a month for holidays such as Valentine's Day, St. Patrick's Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Canada Day, and McLaughlin Day. During the summer, Downtown Automotive Heritage tours introduced visitors to Oshawa's unique automotive landscape.

Automotive Speakers

The museum hosted automotive authors and speakers such as Tanya Bailey-Smith (right) speaking on early car races in Savannah, Georgia. While speakers came to talk at the museum, our curator also presented off-site for interested organizations.





Regular guided tours of the museum have increased visitor satisfaction by creating a personal connection to the collection and the community.

5. COLLECTION HIGHLIGHTS

Object Donations

The Canadian Automotive Museum received the last 1999 Chevrolet Lumina produced at the Oshawa Assembly Plant from GM Canada. Individual donors gifted books, magazines, licence plates, and other automotive items for the permanent collection.



Oshawa resident Jane McDowell donated her 1957 royal tour licence plate desk set to the museum. This rare piece was her award for a primary school essay contest.

Canadian Automotive Library

A partnership with the Oshawa Public Libraries continued in 2018; the museum's collection of automotive books was catalogued into the OPL's online system. More than 600 books are now publicly accessible, along with hundreds of automotive repair and parts manuals. Library card holders may request a book through the OPL, which is delivered to the McLaughlin Branch Local History Room for inlibrary use.



Off-Site Display

The 1926 Bugatti T-37 was displayed at the 2018 Canadian International Auto Show in Toronto. Three other vehicles are currently on view in other museums: the 1914 Galt is at the Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles, the 1905 McLaughlin Buggy is on display at the Remington Carriage Museum in Cardston, Alberta, and the 1912 Brockville Atlas is at the Brockville Museum in Brockville, Ontario.



4.5 Family Programs

Family friendly programs were offered throughout the year. Family Day, March Break, Summer Kids Days, and Doors Open Oshawa were all very popular with children. Spirits of the Automobile, brought the people behind the cars to life through first-person interpretation and Father's Day had extensive programming thanks to a sponsorship from Hagerty Classic Cars.
