

1. ABOUT THE CANADIAN AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM

Our Mission

The Canadian Automotive Museum is dedicated to preserving and sharing Canada's automotive history.

History of the Canadian Automotive Museum

The Canadian Automotive Museum opened to the public in 1963 and was incorporated in 1964 as an independent not-for-profit, charitable institution. The museum is home to the world's most significant collection of Canadian cars and Canadian automotive literature. Today, the museum maintains a collection of over 80 Canadian and international vehicles spanning the 20th century, as well as the Baechler Canadian Automotive Research (C.A.R) Library.

The Canadian Automotive Museum's incorporation number is 106843121 RR0001.

2. 2020 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Elevator Upgrades

With capital funding from the Ontario Trillium Foundation, safety upgrades were made to the museum's car elevator in January 2020.





Canadian Gallery Refreshed

The entire second floor was refreshed with a coat of paint and new LED track lighting. This gallery now has a bright, clean feel that makes the area feel more spacious. The installation of the Oshawa's Automotive Community exhibit now stretches along the south wall taking visitors through 120+ years of history.



Baechler C.A.R. Library

The library was transformed in 2020 with funding from the Museum Assistance Program and a gift from the estate of Glenn Baechler. Over the summer, the 600 sq. ft. space was painted, LED lightening was installed, and new metal shelving was assembled. The entire collection was reorganized and a full inventory began in the fall. This project increased shelf space by more than 50%.




3. 2020 EXHIBITS

Oshawa's Automotive Community

With funding from the Virtual Museum of Canada, our latest exhibit, Oshawa's Automotive Community, opened onsite and online in July. The exhibition was produced in both official languages and traces the history of the auto industry in Oshawa from its origins in the 19th century through the announced closure of the plant in 2019.







Off-Site Display

The museum sent its 1912 Rolls-Royce Silver Ghost, known as "Ladybird", as well as Lightning McQueen, to the 2020 Auto Show in Toronto.

Loans were extended for three of our vehicles displayed at other museums; the 1914 Brockville Atlas (Brockville Museum), the 1905 McLaughlin Carriage (Remington Carriage Museum in Cardston, Alberta) and the 1912 Galt Gas-Electric (Petersen Automotive Museum in Los Angeles).





4. 2020 ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMS

Guided Tours and Group Visits

With visitor capacity limits in place, there were only a few groups visits early in 2020. This included a visit from the Unifor Ladies Auxiliary #27 who came by to see the progress of the Oshawa's Automotive Community exhibit. The Auxiliary donated their archives to the museum and several images were used in the exhibit.



Downtown Walking Tours

Throughout the summer and fall, Board Member Greg Johnston took more than 50 people on downtown walking tours. These socially-distanced events allowed visitors to visit the automotive heritage sites within close proximity of the museum.



Third Thursday Talks

The museum's Third Thursday
Zoom talks were launched in
December with Justin Sookraj
speaking on the DeLorean Motor
Car Company. These monthly
webinars host a range of
speakers on Canadian
automotive topics. They are free
to attend, but donations are
appreciated.



Family Events & Programs

The Canadian Automotive Museum regularly hosts family friendly programs with activities and photo opportunities for all ages. Family Day 2020 was our highest attendance day of the year with 234 visitors.





Park & Picnic Fundraiser

The museum's first Park & Picnic fundraiser began at the museum and ended at ZimArt Rice Lake Gallery in Bailieboro. 50 participants enjoyed a scenic drive through the Ontario countryside, learned about sculpture from Zimbabwe and enjoyed a picnic lunch, sponsored by Hagerty, from Blackhoney Cafe in Peterborough. This socially-distanced event was a big success and we look forward to making it an annual event,


